# **Deed Restrictions / Violations**

For all deed restriction violations recorded in 2010, a letter is sent to the homeowner regarding the violation, with a request for correction. 99% of the reported violations are promptly corrected. The board would like to thank every resident for their cooperation and geat support. As a reminder, the board would like to ask each resident to please to keep our neighborhood looking great. Several items to stay focused on are:

- · General Lawn Care- mowing/edging
- . Improperly parked vehicles
- · Repair / Replace loose or broken fence boards
- Fence Height 6' 6"
- · Hanging / Falling Gutters
- . Materials are to be stored out of sight from street
- Pets being allowed to roam the neighborhood
- Trash Cans left on curbside after collection

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# **Trash Collection Guidelines**

Trash collection is provided by the Water District To keep our neighborhood in top shape, changes were made to the deed restrictions to include the following guidelines:

- Trash containers and recycling bins are to be stored out of view from the front of the house.
- Trash should not be placed at the curbside more than 24 hours before normal collection.
- Trash containers and recycle bins should be picked up from the curb as soon as possible after collection.
- Trash containers and recycle bins should not be placed in the street.

# **MCCIA Planning For the Future**

#### 2011 Financial Overview

In October of 2010, annual assessment bills were mailed. A payment plan was available, which allowed assessments to be paid in three payments. As of 12/31/09, \$27,852 of the 2010 assessments had been paid. Accounts are delinquent if not paid in full by 01/31/2010 and a \$25.00 late fee and interest will be applied. Delinquent accounts will be turned over to our attorney for collection.

# **Security Patrol Projected 2011 Cost Increase**

The 2011 security has a major change that went into effect. Colony Creek dropped out of the contact, which reduced the number of homes in the contact from 2715 to 1576. The cost per home in 2010 was \$ 67.95 and the reduction in the number of homes raised the cost per home in 2011 to 81.16 (19.5% increase). The MCCIA board of directors issued a security newsletter requesting feed back from MCCIA residents. The feed back from our residents indicated that they wanted the continued coverage by the contract deputies. This also impacted the number of deputies that are currently assigned to the contract. MCCIA residents are encouraged to provide any feedback and or comments regarding our continuing the security contract beyond 2011. Future cost increases could lead to the addition of an annual security fee to cover the cost.

#### 2011 Outlook

The financial health of our association is good. The board is always looking ahead to the future to insure that we keep our present health. We continue to work to ensure that the best interests of our neighborhood are kept as the top priority. As always thboard is open to the opinions of each resident.
